- 2. Completly fill in the empty oval to the left of the candidate name or choice in all races you wish to vote.
- 3. If voting for a Write-In candidate, completely fill in the oval to the left of the Write-In selection, then write the name of the Write-In candidate in the space provided.

Warning

- Do $\underline{\mathsf{NOT}}$ use red ink or felt tip pen to mark ballot.
- Do $\underline{\text{NOT}}$ circle, underline or mark through choices. Do $\underline{\text{NOT}}$ use check marks or X to mark ballot.
- Do <u>NOT</u> use check marks of X to mark ballot.

 Do <u>NOT</u> mark more choices per race than allowed.
- Do <u>NOT</u> sign, cut, tear or damage the ballot.

If you make a mistake or change your mind on a selection:

A. Do not attempt to mark through the selection or attempt to erase. Write "Spoiled" across the ballot AND across the return envelope.
 B. Mail or return the spoiled ballot and envelope to your county board of registrars; a new official absentee ballot will be mailed to you.

<u>If you decide to vote in-person:</u> Surrender the ballot to the poll manager at an early voting site within your county or the precinct to which you are assigned. You will then be permitted to vote a regular ballot.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL **AMENDMENTS**

-1-

Provides for suspension of compensation of certain State officers and members of the General Assembly.

Senate Resolution No. 134 Resolution Act No. 304

"Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to suspend the compensation of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State School Superintendent, Commissioner of Insurance, Commissioner of Agriculture, Commissioner of Labor, or any member of the General Assembly while such individual is suspended from office following indictment for a felony?"

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Provides for temporary local tax relief after disasters.

House Resolution No. 594 Resolution Act No. 803

"Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to provide that the governing authority of each county, municipality, and consolidated government and the board of education of each independent and county school system in this state shall be authorized to grant temporary tax relief to properties within its jurisdiction which are severely damaged or destroyed as a result of a disaster and located within a nationally declared disaster area?"

House Bill No. 997 Act No. 859

"Shall the Act be approved which grants a state-wide exemption from all ad valorem taxes for certain equipment used by timber producers in the production or harvest of timber?"

Expands ad valorem tax exemption for family-owned farms and adds qualified products to the exemption.

House Bill No. 498 Act No. 260

"Shall the Act be approved which expands a state-wide exemption from ad valorem taxes for agricultural equipment and certain farm products held by certain entities to include entities comprising two or more family owned farm entities, and which adds dairy products and unfertilized eggs of poultry as qualified farm products with respect to such exemption?"

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SPECIAL ELECTION LIBERTY COUNTY

County One Percent Sales and Use Tax

(Vote for One)

Shall a special one percent sales and use tax be imposed in Liberty County for a period of time of six years and for the raising of an estimated amount of \$69,000,000 for the purpose of paying previously incurred indebtedness of Liberty County and funding the following capital outlay projects within Liberty County: (i) for Liberty County the retirement of previously incurred debt for capital outlay projects financed through the Liberty County Public Facilities Authority for the Justice Center and MidCoast Regional Airport as well as fire and EMS facilities, roads projects, Exit 76 safety improvements, drainage projects, parks and recreation facilities, public works facilities, facilities and equipment for Liberty County Regional Medical Center, public safety facilities, public safety vehicles and equipment, ambulances, economic development capital outlay projects, election facilities and equipment, historical and cultural improvements, county jail, the health department, an event/entertainment center, coroner facilities, Walthourville Freight Connector, and costs related to program management; (ii) for the City of Hinesville roads projects, drainage projects, the acquisition of public safety vehicles and equipment, parks and recreation facilities and other governmental facilities, previously incurred debt for public safety facilities, and public works facilities; (iii) for the City of Midway roads projects, drainage projects, governmental facilities, various government infrastructure, parks and recreation, and public safety vehicles and equipment; (iv) for the City of Riceboro roads projects, drainage projects, governmental facilities, and public safety vehicles and equipment; (v) for the City of Walthourville roads projects, drainage projects, water and sewer improvements, governmental facilities, public safety vehicles and equipment, parks and recreation; (vi) for the City of Allenhurst roads projects, drainage projects, and other governmental facilities; (vii) for the City of Flemington roads projects, drainage projects, governmental facilities, and public safety equipment; and (viii) for the City of Gumbranch roads projects, drainage projects, and governmental facilities?
