How to Become a Firefighter

Liberty County Fire Services

Call Data

Liberty County Fire Services is dispatched to a variety of call types such as medical, vehicle fires, structure fires, brush fires, fire alarms, vehicle accidents, etc. We respond to more than 3,000 calls per year.

Current Status

Liberty County Fire Services has 6 departments serving more than 180 square miles.

Paid or Volunteer

There are two ways to become a Firefighter with Liberty County:

Paid: As a part-time Firefighter, you work 10-hour shifts, up to 3 shifts a week (30 hours max) at one of three different locations.

Volunteer: Getting involved with a volunteer fire department is an incredibly rewarding way to make a positive contribution to your community. It is often a stepping stone to starting a career as a paid firefighter. You do earn a stipend for attending station training nights and when responding to calls.
